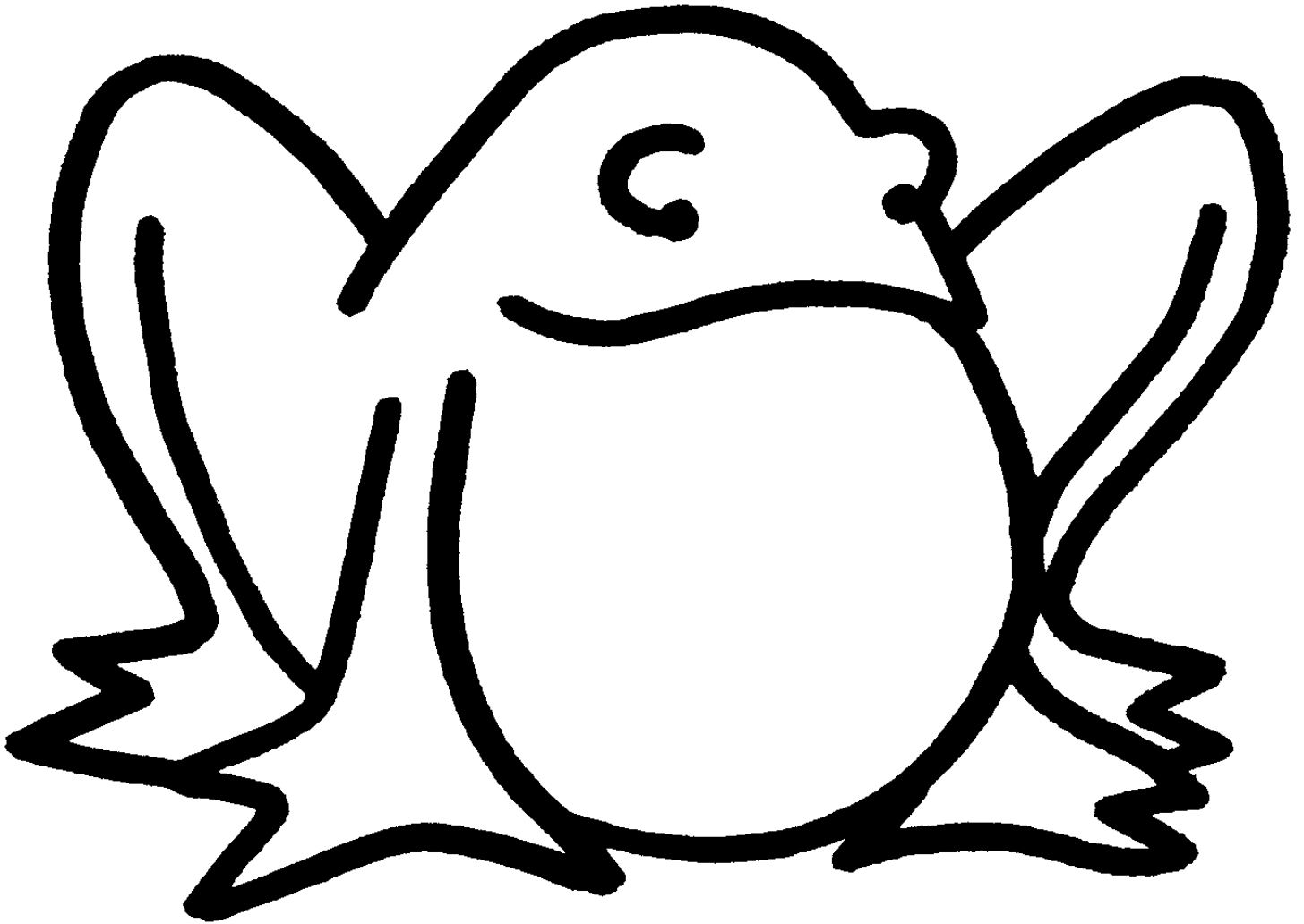


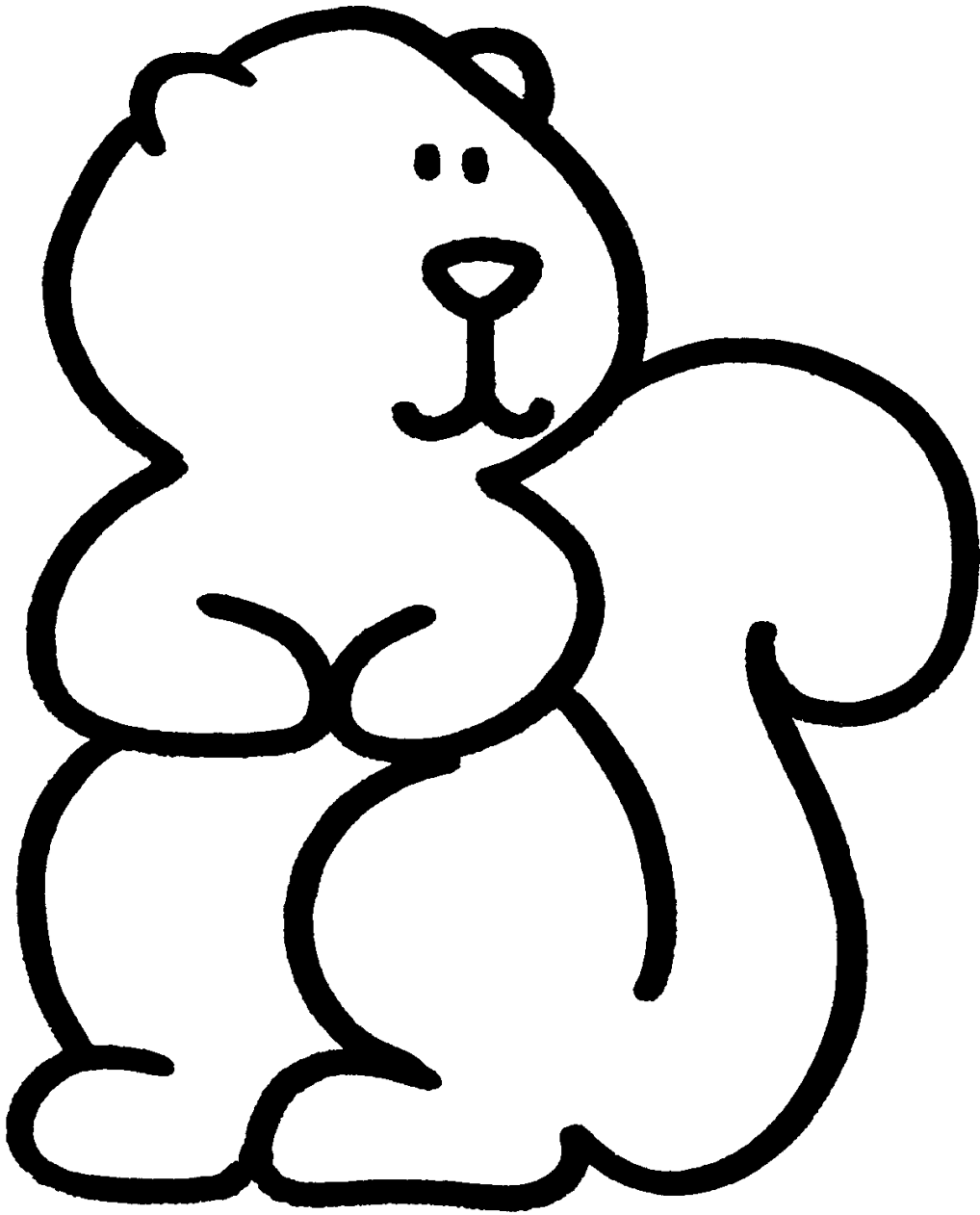
Toad

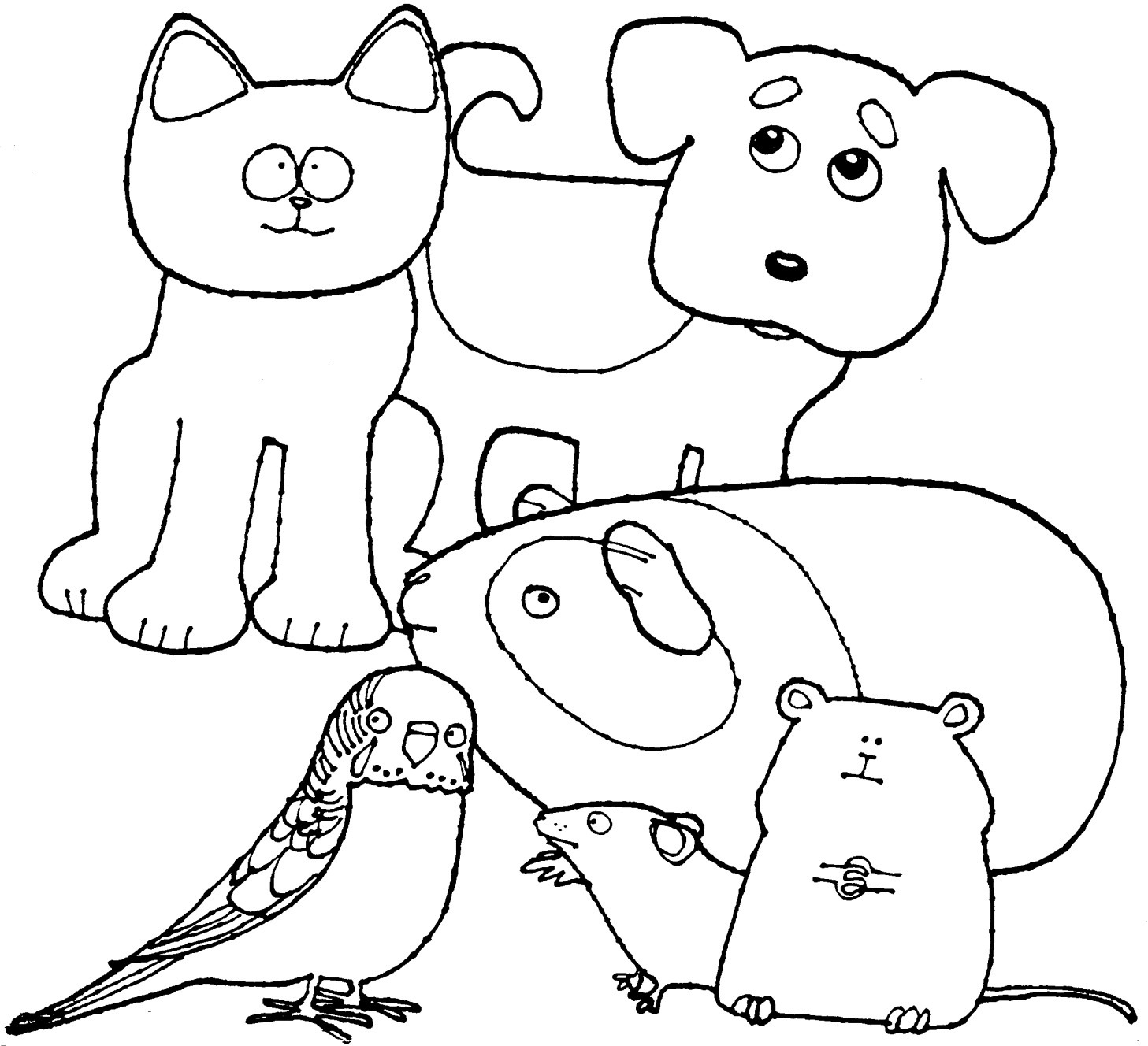

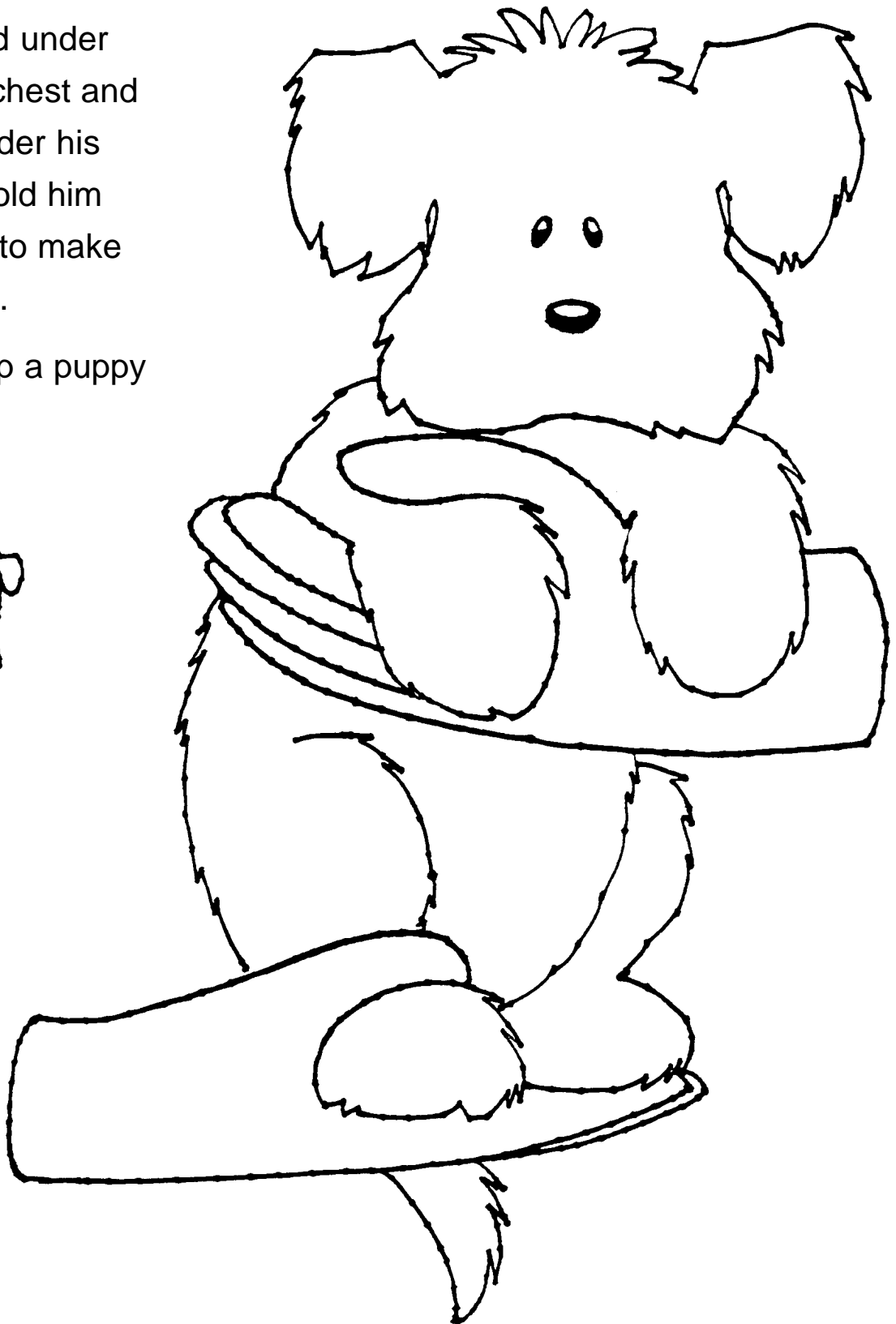
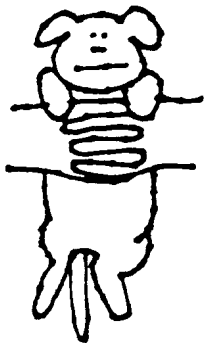
HOW TO HOLD A PUPPY OR A KITTEN

Never pick up a puppy like this,



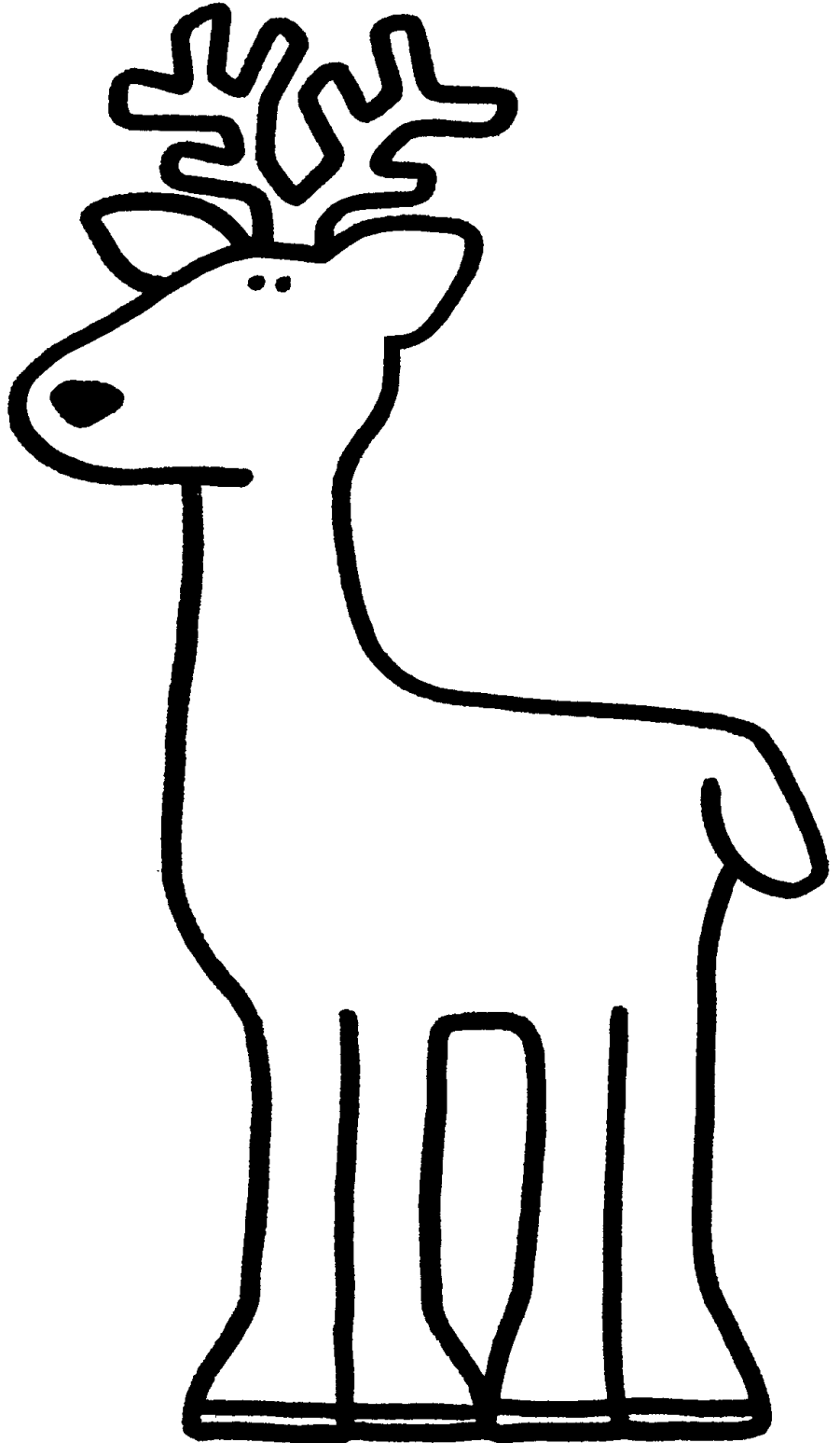

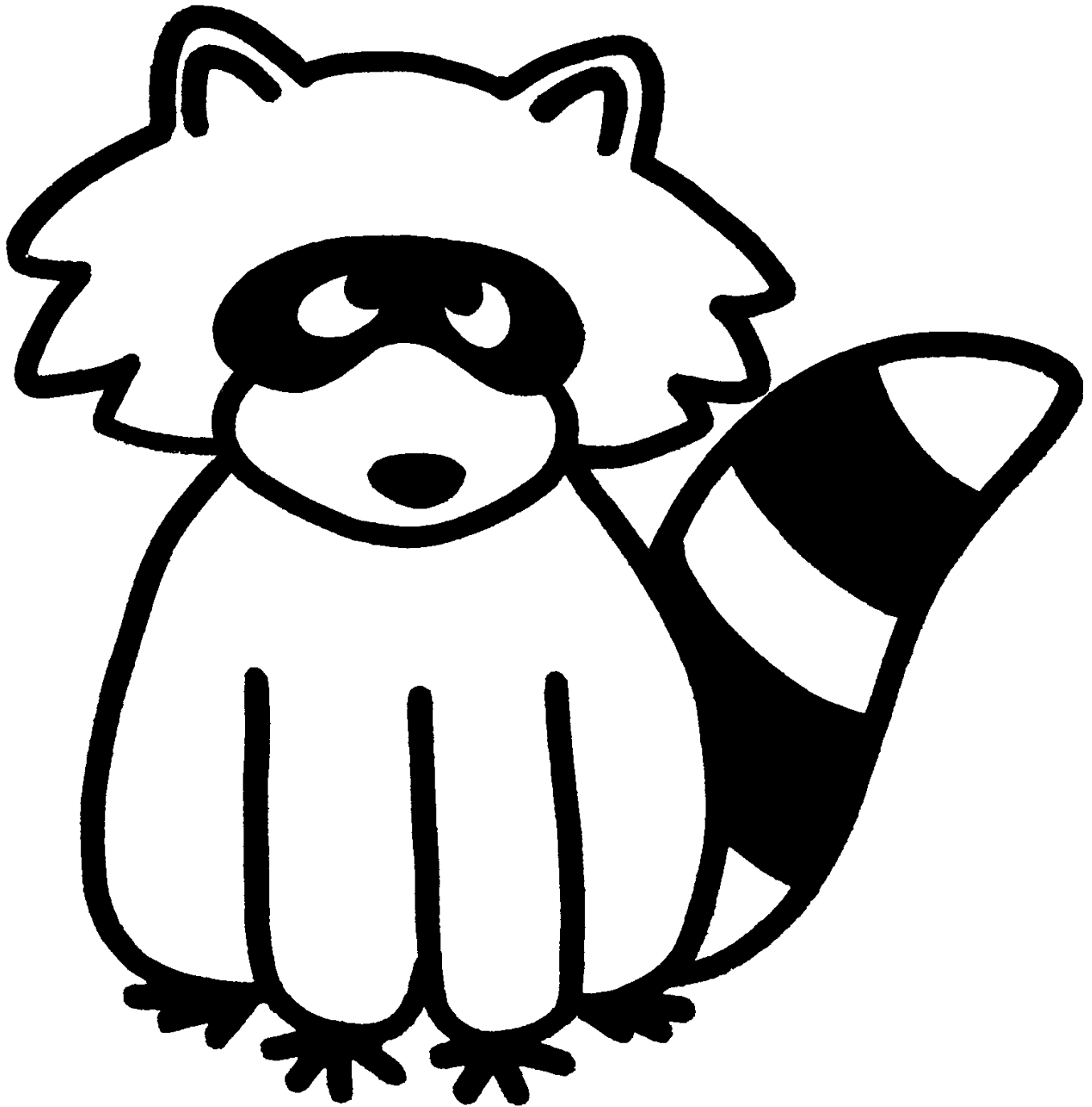
DEER

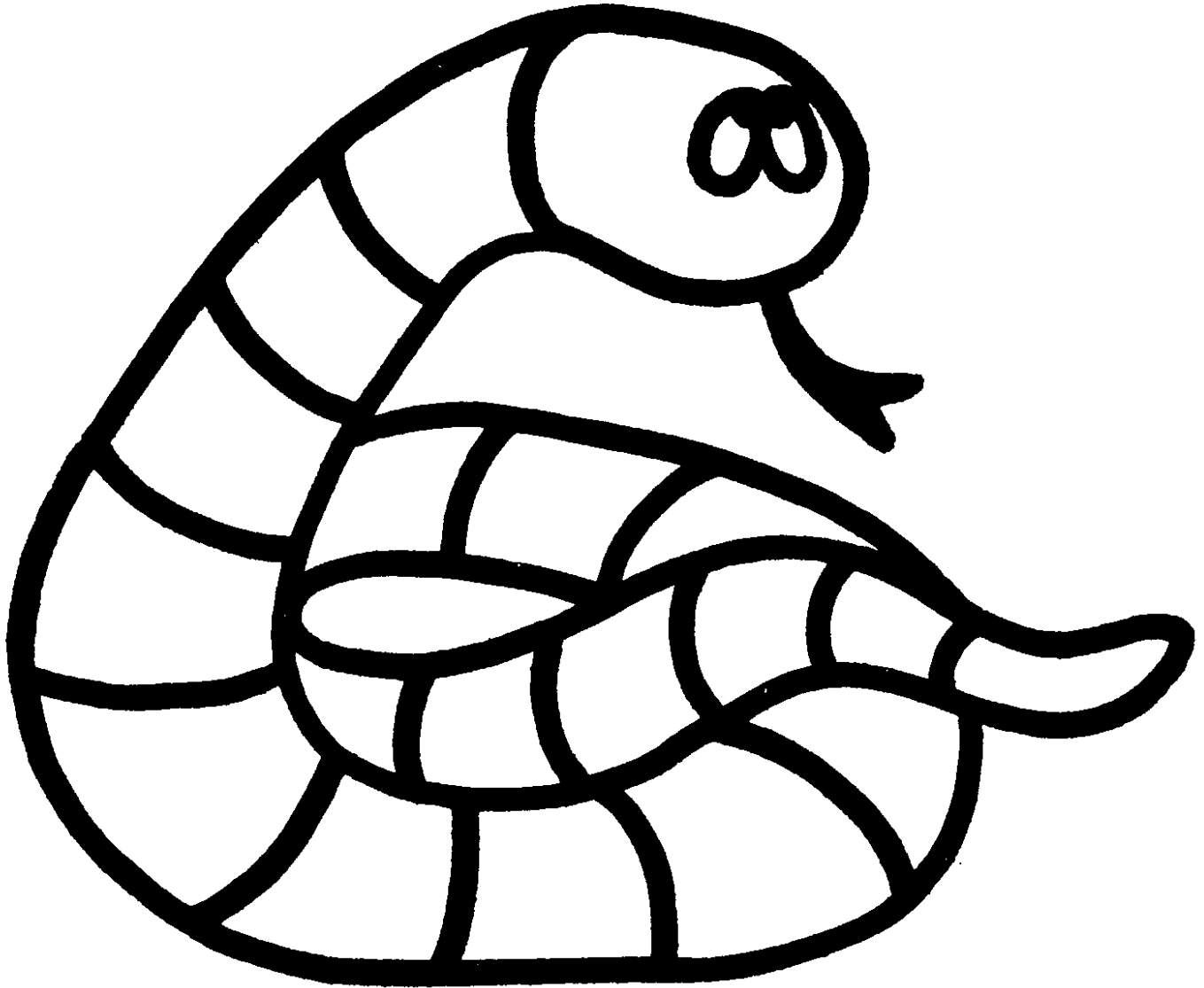
RACCOON

SNAKE

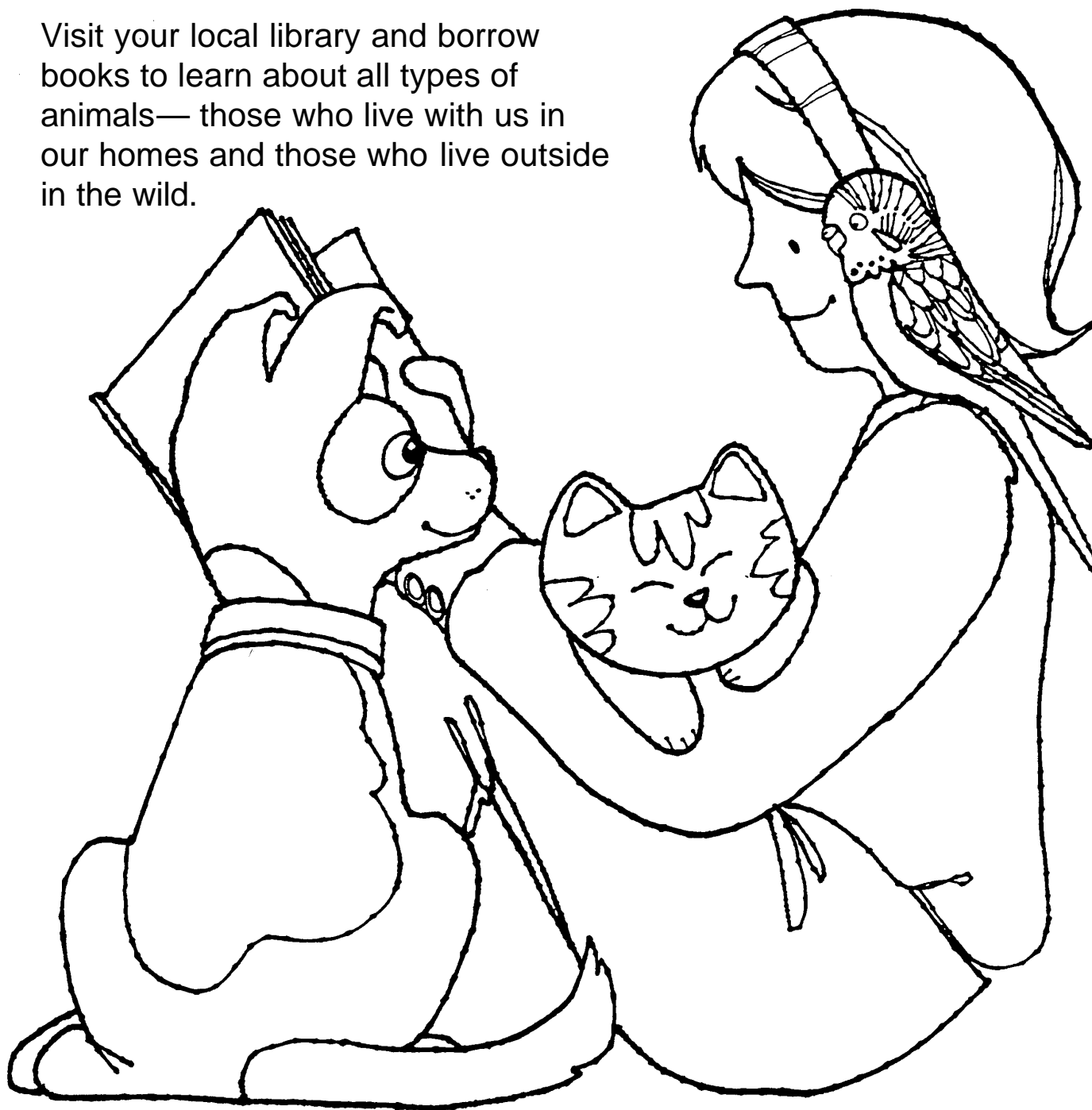

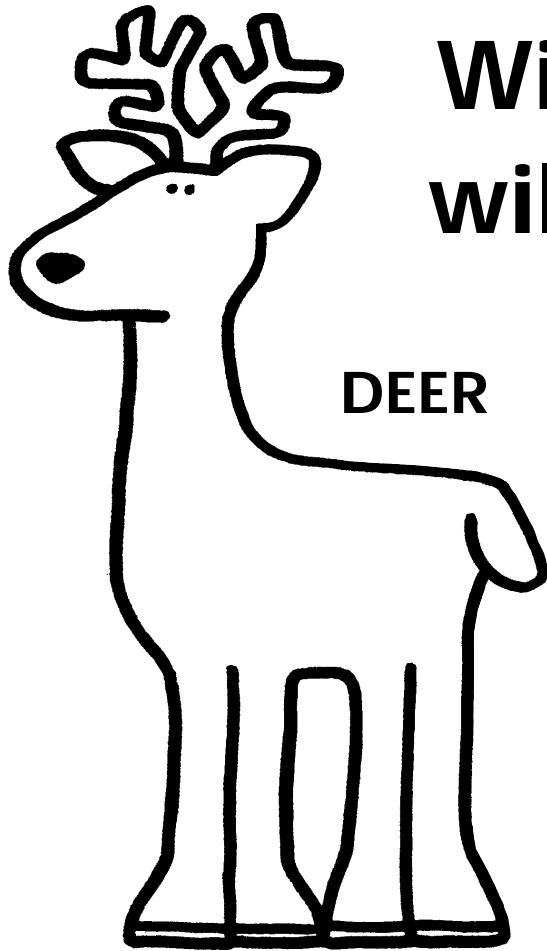
DON'T HURT A BIRD WHO YOU ARE TRYING TO HELP.



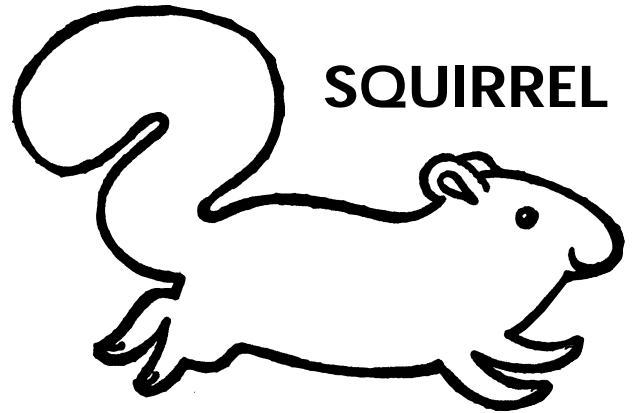
