Project TNR: New Jersey's resource for feral cat and Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR) information *Advocating for feral cats and feral cat caregivers through education and policy initiatives*

The mission of Project TNR is two-fold:

- 1) to support feral cat caregivers through advocacy, networking, education and access to funding
- 2) to introduce Trap-Neuter-Return to New Jersey's communities as the humane, effective and cost-effective method of controlling feral cat populations

For feral cat caregivers or organizations Project TNR:

- administers a feral cat advocate email listserve for sharing of resources and experiences;
- makes available educational materials;
- provides, free of charge, New Jersey's feral cat newsletter, the *Caregiver Connection*, for networking and keeping abreast of the latest news on TNR in New Jersey;
- works with veterinarians to provide low-cost spay/neuter;
- advocates on a state level for funding of TNR;
- assists caregivers with towns, ACOs, apartment managers or condo boards; and
- gives caregiver training workshops.

For municipal officials Project TNR:

- offers presentations to health and animal control officers, mayors and council members on the many benefits of instituting a TNR program;
- helps devise and implement a TNR program;
- connects your town with experienced TNR individuals and organizations in your area who may be able to implement your TNR program with you;
- works with municipal officials to explore funding options and find the lowest cost spay/neuter services in the area;
- helps draft ordinances and policies; and
- provides our expertise, advice and involvement free of charge.

Additionally, Project TNR offers these services to apartment or condominium managers looking to manage feral cat populations.

Support of Trap-Neuter-Return, along with an aggressive public education program emphasizing the benefits of spaying and neutering, is critical in the effort to stem the feral cat population crisis in New Jersey.
