

# FEEDING A STRAY?



*“All they need is a bit of food, they can look after themselves, just like a wild animal.” **WRONG***

*“Call Animal Control—they will take the cat to the shelter and find her a home.” **WRONG***

*“I can’t afford to do anything other than feed them.” **WRONG***



IF YOU DON'T CARE PLEASE ACT!!

Love them or hate them, the solution is the same—SPAY and NEUTER



*“I have no room to take her into my house and no one will help me find her a home.” **WRONG***

All homeless cats at a **MINIMUM** need to be spayed and neutered to prevent their numbers from exponentially multiplying and given immunizations to protect them against rabies.

At an animal shelter, feral cats or cats who are afraid of people will be held for 7 days and then killed. Only friendly cats and kittens stand a decent chance at life if taken to a shelter.

Feeding 1 stray cat who becomes pregnant and has 4 kittens, who then go on to have more kittens themselves becomes far more expensive than spaying/neutering 1 or 2 cats and continuing to feed just those 2 cats.

HELP is out there—you just need to LOOK! There are many rescue groups who can help foster and adopt friendly cats and who may be able to help trap feral cats. There are also **LOW COST** vets and clinics who can spay / neuter these cats for as little as \$25 and **END** the cycle.
